General Information

1. Statewide Assessments will be Canceled for the Remainder of SY 2019-2020

Given the unprecedented COVID-19 situation, health and safety is the primary focus. The Office of Strategy, Innovation and Performance (OSIP) and the Office of Curriculum and Instructional Design (OCID) have been monitoring national and local developments as new information becomes available, and seeking guidance from the United States Department of Education (ED) regarding assessments. The following assessment update is provided based on the latest information to respond to questions that may arise in your schools, thus further changes may occur depending on circumstances.

Given this extraordinary crisis situation, Hawaii Department of Education (HIDOE) was given permission to implement an expedited waiver request that was submitted to the ED for flexibility regarding assessments, accountability and school identification, and reporting requirements pursuant to section 8401(b) of the Elementary and Secondary Act of 1965, as amended. The Hawaii Board of Education discussed this at the April 2, 2020 virtual meeting, where members unanimously confirmed proceeding with the waiver. The opportunity for public comment at <https://bit.ly/WaiverPublicComment> will remain open until April 10, 2020. Thus, federally mandated tests will be canceled for the remainder of school year 2019-2020. These tests include the Smarter Balanced Assessments: English Language Arts/Literacy and Mathematics, the Hawaii State Science Assessments (NGSS) Grades 5 and 8, the Biology 1 End-of-Course Exam, the Hawaii State Alternate Assessments, and the Kaiapuni Assessment of Educational Outcomes (KĀ'EO).

2. The ACT Materials Handling

The March 24, 2020 make-up testing day was canceled due to the extended HIDOE spring break for students. Schools are to return to ACT any unused ACT materials upon reporting physically back to school. The Assessment Section has been working with ACT to determine options to address the canceled makeup date. Information will be shared via the Assessment

News at alohahsap.org as well as through emails to complex area superintendents, principals, and administrators.

Test coordinators who have not yet returned PreACT or ACT test materials should ensure that the materials are stored in a locked and secure location. Any scorable PreACT materials and unused ACT returnable materials should be returned as soon as possible after staff are allowed back into schools.

3. Advanced Placement (AP)

The AP Exam administration will consist of a 45-minute, extended response exam held online at home. The AP Program is working to give every AP student the opportunity to claim the credit they've earned. The exact dates for each course can be found at this [link](#).

4. International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme

The IB Programme has canceled all exams for the May 2020 session. Students and parents should contact the current IB schools, Campbell and Kaiser High Schools, for the latest information regarding IB diploma and certificates.

5. Class of 2020 Seal of Biliteracy Assessments

For the HIDOE-approved online assessments (Avant STAMP 4S and WorldSpeak):

- The last day of the testing window will be extended from March 31, 2020, to May 29, 2020, for:
 - a) Class of 2020 candidates who did not complete their first assessment attempt by end of the school day on March 13, 2020, and
 - b) Class of 2020 candidates who were scheduled to retake their language assessments between March 23 and March 31, 2020.

For the HIDOE-approved 'Ōlelo Hawai'i assessment:

Updates for Class of 2020 Seal of Biliteracy Awards

- By May 8, 2020, the Office of Curriculum and Instructional Design (OCID) will communicate with schools to verify candidates' eligibility to receive the Seal of Biliteracy. Eligibility requirements include GPAs and world language proficiency. Upon verification, OCID will provide schools with Seal of Biliteracy medals to present to candidates who are on track to meeting all eligibility requirements. If a candidate's language assessment result is not available at the time of verification in May, OCID will verify their eligibility requirement at a later time. Should the candidate meet all eligibility requirements, the medal will be mailed out with the Seal of Biliteracy certificate.

If there are additional changes with school closures due to the current COVID-19 situation, OCID will communicate with schools about the next steps for Seal of Biliteracy.
