
1. Smarter Balanced and Science (Grades 5, 8 and Biology EOC) Interim Assessments

The Smarter Balanced and Science Interim Assessments are now available for administration. Test coordinators should remind teachers and test administrators to be careful when selecting assessments, as accidental administrations of the Summative assessments have occurred in the past when multiple assessments were opened simultaneously with the Interim assessments. An accidental misadministration of the Summative assessments is considered a Testing Incident, and a Test Irregularity Form should be filled out and submitted to the Assessment Section. For additional information, the <u>Smarter Balanced Interim Assessments Test</u> Administration Guide (TAG) is available in the Resources section of the alohahsap.org website.

2. Printing Individual Student Reports at Reprographics

The Reprographics Section is assisting us with the printing of Individual Student Reports and many of you are taking advantage of that option. Two important reminders:

1. Be sure to <u>include the Supplemental Materials</u> when you generate the pdf file if you will be sending the file to Reprographics for printing. They use that page as the "separator" when stapling reports together.



2. When the reports come back to you, check through them to ensure that the correct reports are stapled together - that all of the reports in a stapled set belong to the same student.

3. Test Administrator Training for Grade 5 HSA-Alt Interim Pilot

The Assessment Section is conducting test administrator training for the Grade 5 HSA-Alt Interim Pilot on **Tuesday**, **October 12**. Educators who work with HSA-Alt-identified students in grades 5 and 6 are invited to attend since students in both grades 5 and 6 are eligible to take the pilot assessment. The interim assessment is an *optional* assessment. As such, this training is not mandatory but is instead intended for all educators who plan to administer the Grade 5 HSA-Alt Interim Pilot to their grade 5 and 6 students. Committee members will be working online and with multiple interfaces so reliable internet connectivity will be important.

5. ACT Accommodations Requests

The window for entering accommodations requests for the spring 2022 administration of the ACT will open on September 13, 2021. 6. Test Accessibility and Accommodations Terminology Change

TACs should note the change in name from "Late Consideration" to "Qualified Exceptions to the Deadline" for the Spring 2022 accommodations request window. This name change has been updated to clarify that the "Qualified Exceptions to the Deadline" **is for a limited number of circumstances that allows testing staff to request accommodations and supports after the published request deadline**. This window is not an extension of the deadline to submit requests.
