1. Quality Assurance and Site Monitoring Visits

The Assessment Section conducts annual Quality Assurance (QA) and Assessment Monitoring site visits to ensure test administration integrity, improve school guidance and support, and to comply with United States Department of Education requirements for statewide testing. Site visits allow Assessment Section staff and designees to meet with school-level staff who coordinate and administer Hawaii's statewide assessments.

Due to the pandemic, site visits may be conducted virtually via Webex to maintain the safety and security of all students and staff. Should a site visit be conducted in-person, all Department and school safety protocols and procedures will be followed. Please note that any school may be selected for site visits so all public and public charter schools should anticipate the presence of an assessment monitor during the administration of any statewide summative assessment during their respective testing windows.
