## **General Information**

## 1. Fall Testing for Block-Schedule High Schools

Block-schedule high school students in Biology 1 and grade 11 students completing instruction in ELA or mathematics during the first semester, and for the entire school year, can be tested during the Fall Test Window. These are students who will not be taking additional coursework in the respective content area during the second semester. If students will complete additional coursework in ELA, mathematics, or Biology during the second semester, administration of statewide assessments in the respective content area is to be carried out during the respective Spring Test Window. Remember that:

- Block-schedule high school students completing ELA, mathematics, or Biology 1 coursework in the fall, and for the entire school year, can wait to be tested during the Spring Test Window.
- The End-of-Course Exams and Smarter Balanced ELA and Math Grade 11 window will open November 22, 2021 and close on December 17, 2021.
- Testing is conducted in-person on the school campus following the usual test administration procedures with additional protocols to address COVID-19 concerns incorporated into scheduling and setting up the testing room.
- The Smarter Balanced ELA and Mathematics Assessments, as well as the Biology 1 EOC Exam, are required. The Algebra 1 and Algebra 2 EOC Exams are optional.
- For students to take an end-of-course exam (Algebra 1, Algebra 2, and Biology 1), eligibility needs to be set in TIDE. Be sure to check TIDE and set eligibility, if necessary, before beginning any testing.

#### 2. Using Performance Tasks for Learning

- student-centered teaching,
- the use of performance tasks to elicit information about what students know and can do, and

## 7. EL Supports Request

The window for submitting accommodations and English Learner supports requests for the spring 2022 administration of the ACT opened on September 13, 2021 and will close on January 7, 2022. No new requests will be considered after January 7, 2022.

#### 8. PANext Availability

PANext will open on November 1, 2021, for the Spring 2022 administration of the ACT. Test coordinators should verify that they are able to access this site in order to perform the <u>Prepare for Testing</u> tasks in the <u>Schedule of Events</u> on the ACT Hawaii website. Even though schools may use any or all of the three testing windows, test coordinators may only select one window at a time (i.e, treat additional windows like makeup windows, you cannot select a second window until the first has passed).

## 9. ACCESS for ELLs Online Technology Updates

Test coordinators should verify with the school technology coordinator that updates have been made to student test devices and the school Central Office Services (COS) device prior to the start of testing.

#### 11. INSIGHT Secure Browser Updates

The DRC INSIGHT Secure Application is the secure testing software installed on each testing device. For the 2021-2022 administrations of WIDA Screener and ACCESS for ELLs, technology coordinators will need to ensure that the application is installed on every student testing device and updated to version 12 *prior to testing*. Installers for the DRC INSIGHT Secure Application can be found on <a href="https://www.wida.com/wi

If the DRC INSIGHT Secure Application is already installed on a Mac or Windows device, users will be prompted for an update upon launch. If this occurs at the start of a test session, testing may be delayed while the application is updating.
