Procedure that School Test Coordinators Must Use to Have the Spanish Stacked Translation Embedded Designated Support Activated for a Student

Stacked translations provide the full translation of each test item in Spanish above the original item in English on the student's computer screen.

Please contact the HSAP Help Desk at 1-866-648-3712 to request that this embedded designated support be set in TIDE for an identified student.

This information was added to the Smarter Balanced Test Administration Manual on March 16, 2015 on pages 19 and 68 and also on page 105 where this document's change log is located.

Important Information Regarding Students' Completion of Part 1 and Part 2 of the ELA Performance Task (PT)

Part 1

Students must type their answers for each of the research questions in the boxes provided in Part 1 of the ELA PT. If they do not finish typing their answers for all of the research questions before the scheduled test session ends, they must click the "Pause" button at the top of their screens and finish answering these questions during the next scheduled test session. Once the students have finished Part 1 of the PT, they must click the "Next" button at the top of the screen and they will be asked if they wish to review their answers from Part 1 of the PT because they will be unable to edit their responses once they go on to Part 2 of the PT.

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Part 2

After the students start to respond to the last question in Part 2 of the ELA PT, the “End” button will appear at the top of their screens. If they click the “End” button by mistake after starting the last question, two questions will appear in succession on their screens asking them if they want to review their answers before they end Part 2 of the PT and if they are sure they want to end the test. If they answer “yes” to the last question, their test will be submitted for scoring and the student will be unable to return to Part 2 of the PT.

Note: The Mathematics PT does not have two parts. All of the questions are included in one part.
